"When I was taking night classes, I wasn't sure I would have a job after completing my studies. I couldn't afford to pay for professional training, and I was even scared that I would no longer be able to continue to attend school, because I didn't have the means to do so."

AFTER THE READY PROJECT

Thanks to the READY project and with support from OCADES, Élodie received high-quality professional training in plumbing as well as a kit to help her get set up after training. The training allowed her to become a plumbing professional: "I'm now able to install, repair, adjust and maintain sanitary equipment (toilets, bathrooms, etc.) as well as water distribution and evacuation pipes".

Since she was hired as a plumber, Élodie has become more independent. She works on her own and in collaboration with others, and has developed a network of professionals. In addition to the professional fulfilment generated by this new job, Élodie is now able to provide for her own needs (clothing, hairdressing, etc.) and was able to buy a motorbike, in order to move around more easily and independently. Finally, she confided that she was able to pay for her wedding.

What's next?

I would like to pursue further training abroad to learn other practices so that I can be more efficient and bid on national and international contracts.

Élodie's advice

She encourages young people to always work hard and to persevere in their work. For girls in particular, "I tell them to take their work seriously so that they can set themselves apart from the rest of the pack and be proud of themselves and their skills".



Wanting to become a skilled professional, he enrolled with the help of his uncle in training through a certification programme, which led him to the READY project, thanks to a message that was broadcast on the radio.

With this project, Charles received high-quality professional training in rural electrification as well as a kit to help him get set up after training. He acquired technical skills in electricity and is now able to perform diagnostic analyses, identify and resolve electrical problems, perform electrical installations, etc.

"I discontinued my studies after failing to obtain the BEPC certificate. I didn't have any specific area of activity, and I was always looking for odd jobs". Timothée therefore decided to learn a trade. With the help of his uncle, he learned about the READY project and was able to receive professional training through a certification programme after getting in touch with the ANPE (national employment agency).

AFTER THE READY PROJECT

Thanks to the READY project, Timothée developed skills in electricity and even performed his first contract while he was still in training. Through this programme, he acquired professional skills in building and photovoltaic electricity, and received a kit to help him get set up after training. He says he is now able to perform electrical installations and diagnostic analyses, identify and resolve electrical problems, etc. He is currently training four apprentices: two in Ouagadougou and two in Bobo-Dioulasso.

What's next?

She would like to acquire more work equipment in order to avoid the cost of renting equipment for certain projects. She is also requesting support from the READY project to set up a forum for working women in Bobo-Dioulasso.

Have confidence in yourself and in your abilities. Do your work well, don't give up, and always work hard.

BEFORE THE READY PROJECT

"Before enrolling in training, I was in third level at school but wanted to raise livestock". His uncle told him that the READY project was looking to train young people in crop and livestock farming.

So he submitted an application. He was admitted to the training programme for crop and livestock farming in 2018, and earned his professional qualification certificate in 2020.

AFTER THE READY PROJECT

Thanks to the READY project, Boniface acquired professional skills in livestock farming and agricultural techniques. With his new skills, he says: "I returned to the village where I had twoand-a-half hectares of land. I sowed maize, black-eyed peas and soy". He discontinued the traditional methods for raising hens and instead adopted the highly advantageous techniques he learned during the training programme. Doing so has allowed him to efficiently monitor his hens, while also providing manure for his crops: "I now have a piggery with six pigs, 42 rabbits and 37 chicks, in addition to my crop-production activity".

Don't give up, devote yourself entirely to your work, have the courage to keep going even when things seem like they're not going well.

She was repairing radios with her friends, but without any professional training it was very difficult for her to win contracts. The READY project therefore presented a big opportunity for her and allowed her to acquire skills and a certificate so that she could pursue her dream.

AFTER THE READY PROJECT

Thanks to the READY project, she received high-quality professional training in electricity as well as a kit to help her get set up after training. She participated in field-school projects and did two internships (nine months) at an electricity company. With her new skills, she now works for a company in Ouagadougou that specialises in photovoltaic electricity. She is also pursuing "her own independent work on the side during her free time".




